

Morton Rites Set For D. E. Hamilton

MORTON, March 27 (Special)—Funeral services for D. E. Hamilton, 61, who died Wednesday after a lingering illness, will be held at 2:30 p. m. today in Morton Church of Christ with Jesse Brookshire, minister, officiating.
