

Rites Set Wednesday For Morton Veteran

MORTON, Oct. 26 (Special) — Last rites for Lt. Lester E. Howell, who was killed in military service in Europe in World War II, will be conducted at the First Methodist church in Morton at 2:30 p. m. Wednesday with Rev. A. A. Kendall officiating.

Lt. Howell, son of Mrs. W. L. Harris of Morton, served as an AAF flyer, and was credited with destruction of two German ME-109 pursuit planes.

He held the Distinguished Flying Cross, and the Air Medal with two Oak Leaf Clusters.

He was graduated from Morton High school in 1941 and took his primary flight training at Uvalde, basic at Goodfellow and advanced at Moore fields.

Lt. Howell will be reburied in Morton cemetery. Survivors other than his mother include three brothers, Judge Glenn W. Thompson and Eugene Thompson of Morton, Clyde Howell of Amarillo; and a sister, Mrs. Fay McMahan, Morton.
