MORTON, June 27 (Special) — Mrs. Mamie Hamilton, one of four members of a family severely burned June 1 in an explosion that shook their farm home near here, died about 6:40 p. m. Monday in West Plains hospital. She was 52.

Mrs. Hamilton suffered first, second and third degree burns in the blast which resulted when her husband struck a match in the early morning hours. The lighted match set off the explosion, resulting from an accumulation of butane gas.

Her husband, D. E. Hamilton, is still in the hospital where his condition is reported improved but still serious. Mrs. Hamilton's son, Edward and his wife, Louise, were flown to Galveston in a mercy flight by a Reese Air Force base plane recently to undergo skin grafting operations. They are reported recovering rapidly.

Mrs. Hamilton was a member of the Church of Christ. Her body was taken to the Singleton Funeral home here where arrangements are pending the arrival of the son and daughter-in-law from Galveston.

Other survivors include two additional sons, Leon of Morton and Frank of California; four sisters, Mrs. Eva New of Morton, Mrs. Mary Wells of California, Mrs. Ovelin Dyer of Fannin county, and Mrs. Minnie Lightfoot of Honey Grove; a grandson and a granddaughter.
