

## Rites Set For Crash Victim

MORTON, Oct. 12 (Special)—Funeral services will be read this afternoon from the Morton First Baptist church for Raymond Gene McDaniel, 19, of Morton, who was injured fatally in a car-truck collision about 4:30 a. m. Sunday, approximately six miles north of Denver City.

The service will be read by Rev. W. C. Wright, pastor, and burial will be in Morton cemetery, under direction of Singleton Funeral home.

### Passenger in Car

Dep. Sheriff Wallace Anderson of Denver City, who with state highway patrolmen and other officials investigated the crash, said McDaniel was a passenger in a car occupied by three other men. "Topping a rise in thick fog," the car driver failed to see a truck at the intersection of highway 214 and farm-to-market road 396, in time to avoid a crash.

McDaniel died about 9:25 a. m. Sunday in Gaines County clinic at Seminole, officials said. Bob Scott, of Morton, another occupant of the car had been taken to a hospital in Levelland for treatment of injuries, but his condition was not known here this afternoon.

### Others Not Injured

J. C. Houghton, of Morton, the driver of the car, and a Whiteface musician who had played the night before for a dance in Lovington, N. M., were not injured seriously, it was learned.

The driver of the truck, a man named Cole, was not injured.

No charges are likely to grow out of the collision, Dep. Sheriff Anderson said he believed.

The Funeral home said the list of survivors had not been furnished to it, but explained that the parents, and four brothers, of Morton, survive.
